"On average, minority defendants in Yunnan have sentences that are about 1.5 to 8.0 months longer than Han defendants that have committed similar crimes. They are also more likely to lose their political rights. Sentencing is particularly harsh in autonomous counties and prefectures where minorities are concentrated."
